Part IV Narrative Description of Activities

In keeping with the purpose of the Orthodox Fellowship of All Saints of China, Incorporated, the fellowship will be engaged in the translation and distribution of Orthodox Christian writings to any who desire them. The Fellowship will seek funds from within the Orthodox Christian community and from others who may be interested in assisting in this endeavor. The funds will be used to obtain Orthodox Christian writings; pay as necessary for their translation into the modern Chinese language; print and bind the translated writings into suitable form; and, then distribute the translated writings to Chinese-speaking Orthodox Christians both in the United States and abroad. Depending upon the circumstances and need of the individual or organization requesting copies of the translated materials, these materials may be distributed to them free of charge or for a nominal fee to recover expenses.

Part VIII, Line 4a Your Specific Activities – Fundraising

The Fellowship will use mail, e-mail and its website to solicit donations from the Orthodox Christian Community specifically, and the public at large. Fundraising efforts will be largely focused upon identified individuals and groups sympathetic to the aims of the Fellowship and Orthodox Christianity in general. To the extent fundraising directed to these identified parties overlaps with or is connected with more generalized fundraising, it will necessarily reach a broader audience. Likewise, the Fellowship will use its website to facilitate the donation of funds for the translation and distribution of

its printed materials. Finally, the Fellowship will solicit funds from other Orthodox, Christian, and related organizations and foundations which support its aims and goals.

Part VIII, Line 10 Your Specific Activities – Intellectual Property

The Fellowship will by definition be translating written works which may involve the intellectual property rights of the original author, the Church, or some other individual or entity. Likewise, the Fellowship will be creating written works which may enjoy intellectual property protection in their own right. To the extent the translated works require recognition of the intellectual property rights of others, the Fellowship will enter into the appropriate legal arrangements with the holder of the intellectual property rights in the original work. To the extent the translated work generates an independent intellectual property right, the Fellowship itself will hold such rights.

Part VIII, Line 10 Your Specific Activities – Accepting Contributions In Kind

The Fellowship will accept contributions in kind to fund its work. To the extent the donor desires to place any restrictions upon the property contributed in kind, or the use of the income to be generated by the contributed property, the Fellowship will attempt to honor such restrictions to the extent it can in keeping with the legal requirements of 501(c)(3) and with its religious purpose within the tradition of the Orthodox Christian Faith.

Part IX, Line 1 Financial Data

The Fellowship has been promised a start-up grant in the amount of \$3,000.00 by The Order of St. Ignatius of Antioch upon the successful completion of its application for non-profit status and the submission of a budget detailing the intended expenditure of the funds.
